

# Lakeland Track League Wraps Up Season With Title Meet

RANDOLPH -- The Lakeland Track and Field League will end its season with the annual championship meet on Sunday at Randolph High School starting at 1:30 p.m. Randolph, the defending champs, will go into the meet undefeated and must be considered the favorite. Challenging will be teams from Roxbury, Denville, Parsippany, Hopatcong, Mountain Lakes, Dover and Mendham.

Events are run in three age groups: 9-10 years, 11-12 years and 13-15 year-old for boys and girls. In addition to running events, ranging from the 50 yard dash up to the mile, there are long jump and shotput competitions.

Leading the Randolph Juniors are Al Waldron, Jean-nie McGlynn and the McIntosh brothers, Cleo and Tony. Waldron is unbeaten this year in any event in the boys 11-12 age bracket, and he is the current shot-put recordholder. Miss McGlynn sports a string of wins in the 100 yard dash and the 440 for girls, 13 and 14 years old, while both McIntosh boys are standouts in the long jump for their respective age groups. Younger brother Tony also wins his share in the 220 and Cleo doubles his winning scores in the 440.

Mendham's pride is Judy Taylor in the 11-12 age group. A premier sprinter, Judy does double duty competing in the long jump. Mendham miler Cathey Hoadley set the 11-12 girls mile record at Randolph two weeks ago so she will be ready for the championships.

Hopatcong has two big guns in Leigh Iarussi and Mike Flores. Leigh owns the 440 track record at Randolph and Mike stars in the 11-12 long jump and 880 yard run.

The 9-10 year old group mile promises to be hotly contested between Hopatcong's Gary Honan and Curt Sliker of Denville, Denville's brother and sister duo of Chris and Jean Taormina star in the sprint events and Linda Filbert gives Denville a threat in the 11 and 12 year girls mile.

Dover boasts Denise Schmolke, an unbeaten 11-12 girls shot putter. Dave Thomson gives Dover a threat in the 13-15 880.

Roxbury's Tom Voorhees looks tough in the 13-15 mile. Sandy Alexander excels in the running events for 13-15 girls while Jim Henches could be the athlete to beat in the 9-10 shot put.

Medals will be awarded to the first three place finishers in each of the championship events.

# Records Fall In Junior Track

RANDOLPH -- It was a good day for records last Sunday when the Lakeland Junior Track and Field League conducted its annual championship on the Randolph High School track.

It was not a good day, however, for defending champion, Randolph, which was beaten 166-153 by Mt. Lakes, a team it had beaten earlier in the season in a dual meet. Hopatcong finished third (116) followed by Denville (94), first year Roxbury (70), Mendham (36), Parsippany and Dover.

In the record department, there were 29 individual marks and seven of the eight relay records were surpassed.

Leading Randolph was Al Waldron, who won the shot put, 75 yard dash and mile run in the 11-12 class. Other Randolph winners included Gary Hickey in the 9-10 mile (6:01), Jean McGlynn in the girls 13-15 440 (68.1), Tom Mattern in the 13-15 shot put (42-0), and Sue Rohn in the 11-12 long jump.

Roxbury had its share of first place finishers in the championship meet. Ken Balcerski won the 9-10 50 yard dash and the long jump (13-5). Paul Costanzo won the 11-12 220 (28.5), Jim Henches tossed the shot 28-9 in the 9-10 group, and

teammate Sue Morgan won the girls 9-10 shot with 21-5.

Dover's only winner was Denise Schmolke, who took the 11-12 girls' shot put with a 32-5 effort.

# Mountain Lakes Springs Upset In Junior Track

RANDOLPH TWP. — Chris Palazzi's winning long jump in the final event of the day enabled Mountain Lakes to spring a major upset yesterday in taking the team title at the third annual Lakeland Junior Track and Field League championship meet.

Randolph had been heavily favored to take the team title, but failed to score in the 13-14 year-old boys' long jump won by Palazzi with

a jump of 16 feet, 9 inches. A teammate of Palazzi, Chuck Sweeney, finished third.

Mountain Lakes amassed 169 points, 12 of them by Palazzi who also won the 100 yard dash in 11.2 seconds.

Randolph finished with 153 points with Hopatcong gaining third place with 112 points. Other teams and their totals were: Denville 94, Roxbury 70, Mendham 36, Parsippany 18 and Dover 17.

The meet was conducted in six divisions; 9-10, 11-12 and 13-14 year-old age groups for both boys and girls.

Randolph's Al Waldron was the day's only triple winner, winning the shot put (42-10½), the 75-yard dash in 9.3 seconds and setting a record in the boys' 11-12 mile with a clocking of 5:33.8.

There were two double winners other than Palazzi. Barry Balsersky of Roxbury won the 9-10 boys' 50-yard dash and long jump while Leigh Iarussi of Hopatcong, competing in the girls 11-12 division, set track records of 67.8 seconds in the 440 and 9.8 seconds in the 75-yard
