MOVING ON UP

There were a couple teams that made big moves in the New Jersey Top 20 rankings this week. One of them was Mount Olive, which vaulted six spots to No. 9 after its great performance at the Roxbury Invitational last Saturday at Horshoe Lake Park in Succasunna.

At the Roxbury Invit., coach Mike Behre's Marauders averaged 19:41.76, out its four runners in the top 11, and outscored 2012 Meet of Champions winner, 22-30, in the a race where just the top four runners from each tem raced. Mount Olive's top five runners on the day were junior Sarah Masukewicz (19:07), sophomore Alexandra Christian (19:29), senior Sara Christian (19:41), senior Mariah Christian (20:28), and senior Erin Schafer (20:58).

Last year, Mount Olive won the North Jersey, Section 2 Group 3 title, placed second in Morris County for the second straight year, and was fifth at the state Group 3 meet. But this team looks to be even stronger this season than they were last year ago, and has a legitimate shot at winning the Morris County title and the state Group 3 Championship.

The Morris County Championships could be an instant classic between Mount Olive, No. 3 Randolph, No. 12 West Morris, and defending champion Mendham.

THE MO-TOWN EXPRESS IS READY TO RIP

Morristown, the defending Morris County champion and preseason pick to win the state Group 3 title this season, has been holding back in its dual meets this season as coach Paul Buccino tries to make sure all his guys are healthy and ready to rip when the championships meets come around later in the season.

But Buccino said he will unleash his pack at Saturday's Stewart Memorial Invitational at Warinanco Park in Elizabeth when the team defends its A Division title against a very strong field and aims to take down the school record.

The Morristown school record average for Warinanco Park of 16:55.1 was set in 1997. The lineup of Greg Arabagian, Sean Lyons, Rudy Torres, Gavin Pitt, Ben Edwards, Evan Quinn and John Vallachi have the potential to destroy that record.

Morristown will be battling with Millburn, Voorhees and St. Peter's Prep.

HANKO AIMS TO RUN WILD IN THE SAFARI

Josiah Hanko of Trinity Christian, coming off his victory in 15:41.0 at the Wave Mania Invitational last week in Warwick, N.Y., will try for his second straight major win at Saturday's Six Flags Safari Invitational at Great Adventure.

Hanko, the state Non Public B XC champion last year, and Steve Maine of Highland Reg., who won his race at the Briarwood Init. last week, should be among the top runners trying to record the top time of the day. Maine is in a different race than Hanko.

ACROSS THE BORDER

Randolph, ranked No 3 in the state, will take the long ride to Wappingers Falls, N.Y. to run on the Nike North East Regional course when it comptes in at Saturday's Bowdoin Park Invitational.

Randolph, led by junior Liz Lansing, won't be 100 percent after a rough week. Liz Wellman took a bad spill at Garret Mountain late in the race at the Marron Inviational last Friday and suffered a concussion. Carloe Harsch sprained an ankle earlier this week.

Jen Mylnar ran 20:53 with a 17th place, Amanda Angulo ran 22:13, Gabby Rachmaciej in 22:15, and Michele Giambrone in 23:00. Bria was at University of Maryland (colllege visit), and Kati Hsu was at a state chorus event. These girls are talented and will improve each week . We are looking for a great season.

WEINTRAUB LEADS THE CHARGE FOR MORRIS HILLS

Senior Matt Weintraub of Morris Hills, who missed some time earlier in the season with a hip

injury, scored an impressive victory when he ran 16:50 to win the Fastest 4 race at last Saturday's Roxbury Invitational at Horshoe Lake Park in Succasunna.

"I'm happy with it, especially after missing last week with an injury," Weintraub told Brian Deakyne of The Star-Ledger. "I worked hard with my coach and my trainer to be ready to go today. My goal this year is to run under 16:40."

Weintraub pushed his way to the six-second win, despite not leading until near the end. The victory sparked Morris Hills to a team title win over Roxbury, 29-40. Morris Hills teammate John Dennehy finished behind Weintraub with a time of 17:06, which placed him seventh.

"I didn't come in expecting to win, I came in hoping for a controlled race," Weintraub told Deakyne. "I thought if I did that, I would have a better time and I ended up being able to win."

Morris Hills' Michael Gosden (17:18) and Kyle O'Connor (17:26) rounded out the team's finish with tallies in 10th and 11th place, respectively. Morris Hills finished with a team average of 17:10.31.

In the Future 4 race, all four runners from Morris Hills finished in the top nine, including Connor Spalt (18:20) who led the way with a second place finish.

Ian McNally (19:00), Dan Spalt (19:02), and Ganesh Gopal (19:15) finished consecutively in seventh, eighth, and ninth place, respectively as Morris Hills beat Parsippany Hills 23-39 for the team title. Morris Hills finished with a team average of 18:54.63.

Morris Hills has some new faces in the top 7 this season (four to be exact at this time), but coach Sean Robinson said his boys are working hard and are hungry and hope to to surprise some teams this season.
